A structured technique for gathering information from experts (9 to 12 people), consisting of an evaluation of questions and a discussion.

Note: The nominal group technique is composed of the following steps:

- 1. Before the meeting, a literature review is sent to the experts.
- 2. The experts take a few minutes to write down their comments on the questions being studied.
- 3. In turn, each participant contributes an idea, which the moderator records on a flip chart.
- 4. Similar suggestions are then grouped together.
- 5. Each participant privately ranks each idea.
- 6. The individual ranking is tabulated, and the tabulation is presented to the participants.
- 7. The overall ranking is discussed and re-ranked.
- 8. The results are presented to the participants for approval.
