A study to evaluate the effects of exposure to a given intervention or factor, in which the subjects are divided into groups that are exposed or not exposed to the intervention or factor of interest before the outcomes have occurred.

**Note:** Randomized controlled trials are always prospective, but case-control studies never are. Cohort studies may be prospective or retrospective.

Related concept: cohort study.†

**Ant.:** retrospective study.

† A cohort study may be a prospective study, but a prospective study is not necessarily a cohort study: a cohort study involves a methodology, i.e. comparison, that is not necessarily common to all prospective studies. The qualifier "prospective," without further details, indicates only the study's temporal direction.
